Wonders Early Learning + Extended Day believes that workforce professional development is essential to creating meaningful classroom connections between Wonders educators, children, their families, and colleagues. An essential component of the Wonders Grow Your Own Initiative is hands-on coaching and learning. This fall, Jacky Howell will launch this new program at our two early learning programs. Jacky is a former early learning educator, trainer, and author. We are excited that she will be joining the early learning leadership team in supporting our new and experienced classroom teachers.

Curriculum Development and Implementation



The Curriculum & Instruction Specialist is a critical position in our Early Learning programs. The Curriculum & Instruction Specialist oversees learning in all ECE classrooms and provides support, leadership and guidance to Program Directors, Assistant Directors and Teachers. Liza Pringle brings current research and years of experience in her work with our Early Learning teachers. Liza provides resources to teachers and families to support children's learning at home and at school. Working with the Early Learning leadership team, Liza oversees the implementation of the MSDE-approved early learning curriculum and NAEYC accreditation requirements.

Wonders' PDC workshops and training sessions are accessible to local providers and educators and can be tailored to align with specific provider requirements and goals.
