"Expanding access to affordable, quality childcare is one of the best ways we can support our children and grow our economy at the exact same time," said Gov. Moore. "In partnership with the General Assembly, we will continue to help more Marylanders enter the workforce and ensure that every Maryland child grows up with a strong foundation by preserving our commitment to investments in childcare. The roundtable included Maryland State Department of Education Superintendent Dr. Carey Wright; State Board of Education President Josh Michael; Delegate Jared Solomon; and Governor's Office of Children Special Secretary Carmel Martin; County Executive Marc Elrich; Wonders educators and staff: Liza Pringle, Rafiqah Mahdi, Griselda Moreno, Anila Rawasia, and Joanne Hurt; and Wonders parents Jamie Fragale and Brandon Howard.

The visit concluded with Gov. Moore reading "Jabari Jumps" to Leland's Butterfly class. The children loved the Governor's animated reading and sang their "Thank You" song in appreciation.


